#### ABSTRACT

Human Resource is no longer a back-end activity. ### Career Opportunities in Travel and Tourism Sector Dr. Aditya Bhargava, Assistant Professor, Department of Tourism

Not only in India, but with respect to the global perspective, the travel and tourism industry is the largest contributor of foreign exchange. An enormous number of employees either directly or indirectly benefited out of this industry.

Today the travel and tourism sector in India is growing rapidly and is expected to do well in the forthcoming years. In India, the travel industry hopes to create 47 million job opportunities by 2025 and this is the crucial sector where the government is pinning hopes of providing major employment opportunities by providing skill-based training programs and workshops for local youths and also to match the infrastructure to meet the international standards. According to a report published by the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC), India may add another Rs. 8,55,000 erore by the year 2025 just through tourism. As per the calculations of WTTC, tourism industry alone had contributed near about 8.30 lakh erore revenue to Indian GDP in the year 2017, which is 7.4% of total GDP.

Not only in India, but with respect to the global perspective, the travel and tourism industry is the largest contributor of foreign exchange an enormous number of employees either directly or indirectly benefitted out of this industry.

Students after completing Bachelor's/Master's degree in Tourism can find employment in private as well as public sector. In the private sector, candidates can get jobs in travel and tour agencies, airline companies, hotels, cargo companies and transport agencies. In the public sector, one can find job opportunities with Directorates and Departments of tourism of the Centre and the State.


#### What skills a Tourism candidate must possess?



### Union Budget 2019-2020; Major boost for Tourism sector Dr. Aditya Bhargava, Assistant Professor, Department of Tourism

The union Budget 2019-2020 presented by Ms. Nirmala Sitharaman, Union Minister for Finance, Government of India has given major thrust to travel, tourism and aviation industry in India with one nation travel eard, regional airport hub, international level tourism infrastructure development for 17 iconic Tourism Sites across India and Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in aviation and tourism sector.

The Finance Minister said that the Government is developing 17 iconic tourism sites in India into world class tourist destinations which will serve as a model for other tourism sites. These sites would enhance visitor experience



which will lead to increase visits of both domestic and international tourists at these destinations.

The Union Budget has allocated marginally more — a rise of 1.82 per cent and 7 per cent, respectively -to tourism and culture ministries respectively. According to Press Trust of India (PTI), Rs 1,378.53 crore has been allocated for building tourism infrastructure, while Rs 575.50 crore has been allocated for promotion and publicity. For the cultural ministry, an allocation of Rs 875.33 crore has been made for central schemes and projects.

The finance minister said the government will also execute measures to preserve rich tribal culture of the country.

"With the objective of preserving rich tribal cultural heritage, a digital repository is developed where documents, folk songs, photos and videos about their evolution, place of origin, lifestyle, architecture, education level, traditional art, folk dances and other anthropological details of the tribes in India are stored.

The repository will further be enriched and strengthened. One hundred new clusters will be set up in 2019-20 to enable 50,000 artisans to come into the economic value chain.



#### 4. Church Street, Pietermaritzburg, South Africa


This is the city that once saw Gandhi being thrown off a train by a white man in 1893. South Africa's Archbishop Desmond Tutu unveiled the statue.


#### 5. Plaza Sicilia, Buenos Aires, Argentina

In the 15th year of India's independence, the Indian government gifted a Gandhi statue, made by Ram Vanji Sutar, to Argentina.









There are many things in the world to experience. In the Himalayas, there are many places related to mythological stories. Sometimes we utter about losing our culture and heritage. But if you travel in deep Himalayas, you will find people living with nature in this era also. Even nature plays its role and signals us that nothing is supreme than her.

There's a lake in Himalayas which is so beautiful in landscape and gives mirror effects to the one who sees it. This lake is known as **Sareyolsar Lake** which is situated in high Himalayas of Kullu District. There is a **temple of Buddhi Nagin** which is considered mother of 60 Naag devtas. It is also said that a temple of the goddess lies under the lake. The water of lake is considered holy and pilgrims visiting the lake and take this water with them because of its healing properties. You will not find any piece of paper or a leaf or any twig of tree floating in this lake. A sparrow (named as Abhi) is supposed to be responsible for cleaning this lake every morning and keeps the water crystal clear. Even a dry leaf from the trees around is picked up by this little bird. People offer fresh clarified ghee as prashad around the lake, when their wish comes true.

The lake is situated at an altitude of 3,199 meters from sea level. It is surrounded by thick vegetation of alpine forests. One has to hike around 5 kms from Jalori pass to reach this place, which is around 80 kms from Kullu. In winter, Sarcyolsar experience snowfall up to 5-8 ft. The place is best to visit during summers. People visiting this place are advised to come with their own food and necessary woollen clothing.

This might sound crazy but one will believe this truth, only when he/she visit the place.

#### 13. Shark Tourism:


Watching sharks and their life underwater is called as Shark tourism. The humans are inside a cage and can watch and picture the amazing creature underwater.


#### 14. Avi tourism:

### Great Himalayan National Park (GHNP) : A UNESCO World Heritage Site Mr. Vishal Chaudhary, Assistant Professor, Department of Tourism

Great Himalayan National Park is located in south east of Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh. It was established in 1984 and it got the status of national park in 1999. It is spread over 1171 sq. km. It has four major valleys viz. Tirthan, Sainj, Parvati and Jiwanala valley. This protected area is known for its diverse ecosystem, flora and fauna and its natural beauty. The park protects over thousand plant species which include many medicinal herbs, mammal species, bird species and also amphibian reptiles and insects. The uniqueness of the park is the highly endangered Western horned Tragopan pheasant (also the logo of the NP) and musk deer which are the beautiful creation of nature and are found only in this protected area. These secluded valleys feature lush coniferous forests, emerald meadows, overlooked mesmerizing Himalayan peaks and pristine glaciers. GHNP got its status of world heritage site by UNESCO in 2014, in recognition of its outstanding significance for biodiversity conservation. The



park attracts many tourists and it focuses majorly in Eco-Tourism and Community based Eco-Tourism (CBET).

From past 10 years' tourists have started visiting the park and its valleys in numbers. It is still unknown to many of the people and major factor for the sustainability of GHNP is its 'Roadlessness'. There are other parks in India but they have road connectivity, visitors do jeep Safaris, etc. but here in this National Park one has to hike for a day to reach the boundary of the park. Many of the tourists return back as they're not comfortable to trek in the hills. This is also the reason that flora and fauna is safe here and nature is neat, clean and well protected. The one who visit the park are the special Interest Tourists and they show a keen interest in visiting this virgin region of Himalayas. The USP of this National Park is the beautiful creation of nature that is Western Horned Tragopan, which is one of the beautiful and rarest pheasant of the world. A lot of visitors wish to see this bird and it is all about luck and patience of theirs to get a sight. People visit to see Snow Leopards, Leopards, Himalayan Black and Brown Bear, Musk Deer, Blue Sheep, Monal Pheasant, Kaleej and Cheer Pheasant, etc. The park is also home for many rare species of herbs like Taxus wallichiana (Rakhaal), Morchella mushrooms, blue poppy, wild garlie, guggal dhoop, Nag Chhatri and various species of rhododendrons. The Tirthan River, which origins from the National park is also home for Rainbow trout and brown trout. People visit this area usually for Educational Tourism, Research Tourism, Rural Tourism, Adventure Tourism, Wildlife Photography Tourism, Community Based Eco-tourism, Ayurvedic Tourism, Star gazing, Forest learning Tours, etc.

So if someone is a true nature lover or he/she wish to learn the life lived with nature and forest. This might be the perfect location for them.
