
World Environment Day Commemorated at the UoP

The pro vice chancellor provided valuable insights in their closing remarks, emphasizing the importance of balancing technological advancement with human values and ethics. They applauded the participants for their well-researched arguments and encouraged continued exploration off such critical topics.
